

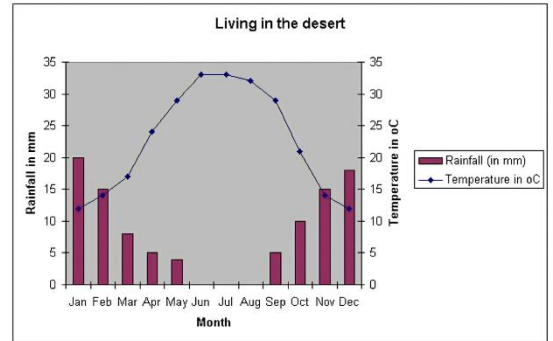
The Incredible Desert Biome!

Climate and Weather:

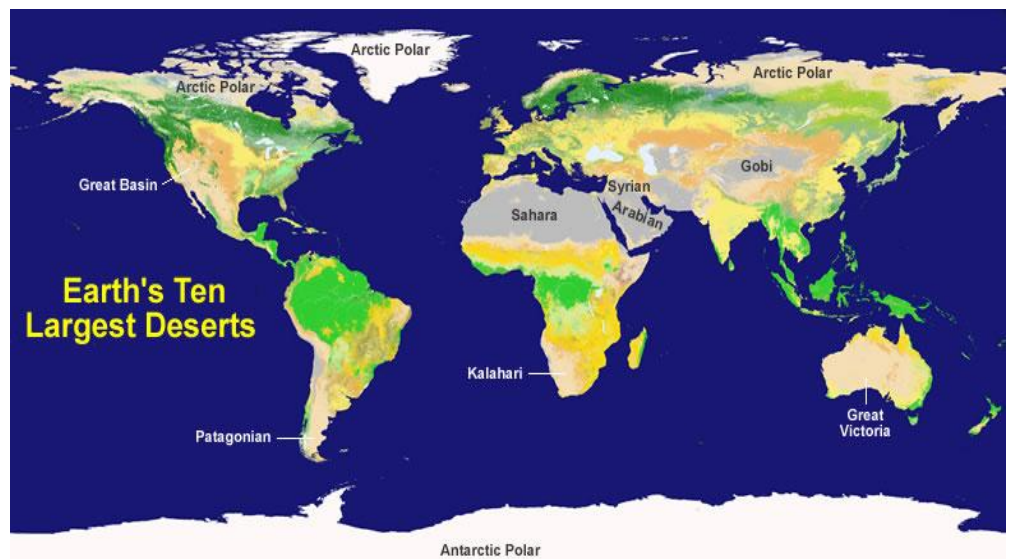
- The desert biome is known for extreme temperatures, with scorching hot days (up to 50°C or 122°F) and cold nights (as low as -1°C or 30°F).
- Very little precipitation, receiving less than 25 cm (10 inches) of rain per year.
- Some deserts, like the Atacama Desert, receive almost no rainfall at all!
- Occasional sandstorms and droughts are common.



Location of the Biome:

- Deserts are found on every continent except Europe.
- Major deserts include:

- **Sahara Desert** (Africa)
- **Gobi Desert** (Asia)
- **Mojave Desert** (North America)
- **Atacama Desert** (South America)
- **Great Victoria Desert** (Australia)



Animal Life:

- **Camel:** Stores fat in its hump for energy and can survive for days without water.
- **Fennec Fox:** Has large ears to release heat and blend into the sand for camouflage.
- **Scorpion:** Nocturnal and has a tough exoskeleton to prevent water loss.



Plant Life & Vegetation:

- **Cactus:** Stores water in its thick stems and has spines instead of leaves to reduce water loss.

- **Creosote Bush:** Produces chemicals to prevent other plants from growing nearby, reducing competition.
- **Mesquite Tree:** Has deep roots (up to 50 feet) to reach underground water sources.



Environmental Issues:

- **Desertification:** Expanding deserts due to climate change and deforestation.
- **Water Scarcity:** Overuse of water sources for agriculture and human settlements.
- **Conservation Efforts:** Protecting desert ecosystems by limiting land degradation, using sustainable water management, and establishing protected areas.
- **Image:** A cracked, dry landscape to show desertification.
